

SUNDAY'S READINGS

Gospel Meditation

The Epiphany of the Lord

Have you ever wondered *why* the magi had gold, frankincense, and myrrh? Matthew's Gospel tells us, "Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh" (Matt. 2:11). Why are these things their "treasures"? One possible answer is they were magicians and astrologers, and these three items were the tools of their questionable trade. In offering them to Christ, they demonstrate that they will cease using such items to predict or control life. They place this baby-king, the God of Israel, at the center of their lives, and not their own devices of control, manipulation and prediction.

Isn't that what we need to do, too? Consider, for example, the magical power of money, symbolized by the magi's gold. Seemingly whatever we ask of money, it does. It wields a god-like power over the world. It can predict the future by guaranteeing better outcomes for us — which is why it is such a tempting alternative to trusting in God. The problem is such absolute trust in money enslaves us to the economic forces that make money so powerful. In paying homage to Jesus with "gold" (i.e., tithing), we participate in his authority over (and therefore freedom from) the magical sway of money.

What things in your life do you use to predict or control your future? What in your life seems to give you power over the world? Those are your treasures. Are you tired of feeling enslaved to them? Find a way to open them and give them to Christ, and you will be freer.

RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

The Answer

Have you ever had an epiphany?

I'll confess that I've never spent much time reflecting on the term "epiphany." In my head, there has always been a strict separation of church and state when it comes to this word. I think of the religious feast of the Epiphany, when we celebrate the magi's encounter with the Christ Child, as totally distinct from our modern understanding of the ancient Greek word *epipháneia*, which means "manifestation" or "appearance."

"I've had an epiphany," I have said many times before, and what I mean is that I have come to a long-awaited realization. I have received the answer to a question which has perplexed me, perhaps troubled me. I now know what course of action I must take.

"Today is the Epiphany," I say to my children when we make a king cake and bring the little magi figures to our Nativity beneath the Christmas tree (which will, after today, be put back into storage, for the Christmas season has come to its fulfillment).

And I've always thought I meant I was saying two very different things.

But today, I ponder the journey of the magi, one that must have often been treacherous and uncomfortable. I think about their meeting with Herod, a situation that certainly was fraught with tension and fear. And I imagine the feeling in their hearts as they approached the young Messiah and fell to their knees. I think of the peace they must have felt. The new, vibrant awareness of what their own purpose was.

It was an epiphany for them — a discovery of truth. An answer.

It should be the same for us.

Meditación del Evangelio

La Epifanía del Señor

¿Alguna vez te has preguntado por qué los magos tenían oro, incienso y mirra? El Evangelio de Mateo nos dice: “Entonces abrieron sus tesoros y le ofrecieron presentes: oro, incienso y mirra” (Mateo 2:11). ¿Por qué son estas cosas sus “tesoros”? Una posible respuesta es que eran magos y astrólogos, y estos tres objetos eran las herramientas de su cuestionable oficio. Al ofrecérselos a Cristo, demuestran que dejarán de utilizar tales objetos para predecir o controlar la vida. Colocan a este bebé-rey, el Dios de Israel, en el centro de sus vidas, y no sus propios dispositivos de control, manipulación y predicción.

¿No es eso lo que debemos hacer también nosotros? Consideremos, por ejemplo, el poder mágico del dinero, simbolizado por el oro de los magos. Aparentemente, todo lo que le pedimos al dinero, lo hace. Ejerce un poder divino sobre el mundo. Puede predecir el futuro al garantizarnos mejores resultados, por eso es una alternativa tan tentadora a confiar en Dios. El problema es que esa confianza absoluta en el dinero nos esclaviza a las fuerzas económicas que hacen que el dinero sea tan poderoso. Al rendir homenaje a Jesús con “oro” (es decir, el diezmo), participamos de su autoridad sobre el poder mágico del dinero (y, por lo tanto, nos liberamos de él).

¿Qué cosas de tu vida utilizas para predecir o controlar tu futuro? ¿Qué cosas en tu vida parecen darte poder sobre el mundo? Esos son tus tesoros. ¿Estás cansado de sentirte esclavo de ellos? Encuentra una manera de abrirlos y dárselos a Cristo, y serás más libre.

La Respuesta

¿Alguna vez has tenido una epifanía?

Confieso que nunca he dedicado mucho tiempo a reflexionar sobre el término "epifanía." En mi cabeza, siempre ha habido una estricta separación de la iglesia y el estado cuando se trata de esta palabra. Pienso en la fiesta religiosa de la Epifanía, cuando celebramos el encuentro de los Reyes Magos con el Niño Jesús, como algo totalmente distinto de nuestra comprensión moderna de la antigua palabra griega *epipháneia*, que significa "manifestación" o "aparición."

"He tenido una epifanía," lo he dicho muchas veces antes, y lo que quiero decir es que he llegado a una realización largamente esperada. He recibido la respuesta a una pregunta que me ha dejado perpleja, tal vez me ha inquietado. Ahora sé qué curso de acción debo tomar.

"Hoy es la Epifanía," les digo a mis hijos cuando hacemos una rosca de reyes y llevamos las figuritas de los Reyes Magos a nuestro Nacimiento debajo del árbol de Navidad (que, después de hoy, se volverá a guardar, porque el tiempo de Navidad ha llegado a su cumplimiento).

Y siempre he pensado que quería decir dos cosas muy diferentes.

Pero hoy, reflexiono sobre el viaje de los magos, uno que a menudo debe haber sido traicionero e incómodo. Pienso en su encuentro con Herodes, una situación que ciertamente estaba llena de tensión y miedo. Y me imagino el sentimiento en sus corazones cuando se acercaron al joven Mesías y cayeron de rodillas. Pienso en la paz que debieron sentir. La nueva y vibrante conciencia de cuál era su propio propósito.

Fue una epifanía para ellos, un descubrimiento de la verdad. Una respuesta.

Debería ser lo mismo para nosotros.




