

GOSPEL MEDITATION

7TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

One of my favorite new singers/songwriters is Noah Kahan. I'm a little biased because, like me, he is originally from Vermont. In a fine song entitled "Stick Season," he sings of his hope to "cancel out the darkness I inherited from dad." This lyric articulates his painful recognition of a dark spiritual "inheritance" from his father, and his hope to be free of it. We all inherit some degree of evil from our earthly forebears. It's easy to feel doomed to repeat their darknesses.

But we're not so doomed, thank God. This week's Gospel proclaims this. Whatever good or bad we received from our parents, we have a more definitive and perfect inheritance in God. Jesus commands us, **"Be merciful just as your Father is merciful"** (Luke 6:36). We have a perfect Father in heaven and are destined to inherit and reflect *that* perfect and merciful love. We have an inheritance of light, not darkness, and thus a whole new possibility of magnanimous love. Like any inheritance, this is a free gift to us.

What are we destined to repeat? Not the darkness of our earthly parents. We are destined to be a reflection of God's life. Jesus liberates us from the inevitability of repeating whatever evils and imperfections are in our familial or cultural upbringings. It's time to claim that perfect inheritance.

RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

Judgment and Love

"Oh, well. I'm going to hell anyway, right?"

I have a few family members and friends who are not practicing Catholics who say this to me from time to time. It's always spoken in a teasing manner, with a wink and a shoulder shrug, usually to explain away some sort of minor misbehavior they feel guilty about.

It saddens me that Christians have somehow gained this reputation as a people who judge, who condemn. I think in part it stems from a misunderstanding on the part of unchurched people (and lots of churched ones, too) regarding what constitutes "judging." It is absolutely not "judging" someone to disagree with a personal decision, whatever that decision may be, or to decline from participating in that decision. We all have functioning consciences; we are all supposed to discern the moral goodness of any action before we take it. But it is judging someone if we allow their decisions to impact how we treat them.

Today's Gospel is an invitation for us to consider how we engage with people who disagree with us — or maybe even actively dislike us. Much is said these days of the "culture wars." I certainly don't disagree that it can often feel like you're fighting a war when you're trying to live as the Church teaches. The forces against you often seem overwhelming and nefarious. And guess what? They are.

But we need to remember who the enemy really is. The enemy is not other children of God, even if they are children of God who are actively promoting ideas that are wrong. Perhaps these people are misguided and mistaken. Perhaps they are misled by the devil. Have we not all been misled by him at some point?

We must interact lovingly with people who think differently and live differently from us. The Christian life absolutely demands it.

Todos heredamos algún grado de maldad de nuestros antepasados terrenales. Es fácil sentirse condenado a repetir sus oscuridades.

Pero no estamos tan condenados, gracias a Dios. El Evangelio de esta semana proclama esto. Cualquiera que sea el bien o el mal que hayamos recibido de nuestros padres, tenemos una herencia más definitiva y perfecta en Dios. Jesús nos ordena: “Sean misericordiosos como su Padre es misericordioso” (Lucas 6:36). Tenemos un Padre perfecto en el cielo y estamos destinados a heredar y reflejar ese amor perfecto y misericordioso. Tenemos una herencia de luz, no de oscuridad, y por lo tanto una posibilidad completamente nueva de amor magnánimo. Como cualquier herencia, este es un regalo gratuito para nosotros.

¿Qué estamos destinados a repetir? No la oscuridad de nuestros padres terrenales. Estamos destinados a ser un reflejo de la vida de Dios. El Juicio y el Amor

“Oh, bueno. Voy a ir al infierno de todos modos, ¿verdad?”

Tengo algunos familiares y amigos que no son católicos practicantes que me dicen esto de vez en cuando. Siempre se habla de manera burlona, con un guiño y un encogimiento de hombros, generalmente para explicar algún tipo de mal comportamiento menor por el que se sienten culpables.

Me entristece que los cristianos de alguna manera se hayan ganado esta reputación como un pueblo que juzga, que condena. Creo que, en parte, se deriva de un malentendido por parte de las personas que no asisten a la iglesia (y también a muchas personas que asisten a la iglesia) con respecto a lo que constituye “juzgar.” No es en absoluto “juzgar” a alguien que no esté de acuerdo con una decisión personal, sea cual sea esa decisión, o que se niegue a participar en esa decisión. Todos tenemos conciencias funcionales; Se supone que todos debemos discernir la bondad moral de cualquier acción antes de llevarla a cabo. Pero si es juzgar a alguien si permitimos que sus decisiones afecten la forma en que lo tratamos.

El Evangelio de hoy es una invitación para que consideremos cómo nos relacionamos con las personas que no están de acuerdo con nosotros, o tal vez incluso a quien le desagradamos activamente. Mucho se habla en estos días de las “guerras culturales.” Ciertamente no estoy en desacuerdo con que a menudo se puede sentir como si estuvieras peleando una guerra cuando estás tratando de vivir como la Iglesia enseña. Las fuerzas en tu contra a menudo parecen abrumadoras y nefastas. ¿Y adivina qué? Lo son.

Pero necesitamos recordar quién es realmente el enemigo. El enemigo no son los otros hijos de Dios, incluso si son hijos de Dios que están promoviendo activamente ideas que son incorrectas. Tal vez estas personas estén equivocadas y mal guiadas. Tal vez estén engañados por el diablo. ¿No hemos sido todos engañados por él en algún momento?

Debemos interactuar amorosamente con personas que piensan y viven de manera diferente a nosotros. La vida cristiana lo exige absolutamente.




