Gospel Meditation

13th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Sin isn't given its due these days. Downplaying sin is dangerous. But there is also another spiritual misstep in which we make way too big a deal out of sin. It happens, for example, when we persistently wonder if our confessed sins are "really" forgiven, or suspiciously ponder what God "really" thinks about us, behind His merciful face. Or when someone returns to Church, and we question whether his or her conversion was genuine. Or when we commit some sin and put on a sad face for days, thinking, "Maybe my sins are too great for God to deal with." God save us from that attitude!

Well, he does just that, this week, in the raising of Jairus' daughter. The dead twelve-year-old's house is filled with a spirit of excessive moaning and groaning, tumultuous weeping and wailing. They even laugh at Jesus in a mocking tone. It's shocking how easy it is for him to raise the dead

child. It is equivalent to gently waking a kid from a light nap. And then he sends her off to get some lunch. No big whoop. The overactive drama is actually part of the problem, and removing it is a key part of the miracle.

Friends, sin can and does kill, but Jesus is always ready and able to raise us back to life, often without much hullabaloo. His ease of forgiving should never be a pretext for presumption, minimizing sin, or taking lightly the cost he pays for our sins on the cross. But for God's sake, we often need Jesus to put out the weepers and wailers. He's the Lord. And remember, the girl is not dead, she's just sleeping.

The Touch of Christ

For a long time, I didn't understand why the virtual Masses of the pandemic were so wearisome to me. Theoretically, shouldn't it be a tired mother's dream, fulfilling her Sunday obligation from the couch, not having to worry how much noise the kids are making?

But it wasn't. Seeing Mass without experiencing it left me hungry. It left me starving.

Then a wise priest explained it to me. "Watching virtual Mass is like taking a virtual shower," he said.

Grace might not be something we can see with our eyes, but it is very much something that is transmitted physically. Jesus has a human body for a reason. He needs to touch people.

We see that nowhere more clearly than in this Gospel. The crowds are pressing on him, everyone trying to get close, everyone trying to share his space. The hemorrhaging woman claws her way through, desperate to make physical contact with him, any part of him, even his cloak. The synagogue official begs Jesus to come and "lay hands" on his daughter, knowing that this is the only way for her to survive. He doesn't ask for Jesus' good thoughts or approving gaze. He knows that isn't what he needs.

In the Gospels, Jesus saves people chiefly through his own touch because he wants to show us — you and me, sitting in the pews — something very important about how we are saved.

But where do you and I find the touch of Jesus Christ? Where do you and I find salvation?

It's in the water flowing over the infant's forehead. It's in the Host dissolving on our tongues. It's in the oil that is pressed to the skin of the confirmand, the dying man, and the brand-new priest. It's in the embrace of the newly married couple. It's in the extended hand of the priest as he says, "Your sins are forgiven."

It's still here, two thousand years later. It's still waiting for us to reach out and grasp it.

Meditación del Evangelio

13° Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

Al pecado no se le da su merecido en estos días. Minimizar el pecado es peligroso. Pero también hay otro paso en falso espiritual en el que le damos demasiada importancia al pecado. Sucede, por ejemplo, cuando nos preguntamos persistentemente si nuestros pecados confesados son "realmente" perdonados, o reflexionamos sospechosamente sobre lo que Dios "realmente" piensa de nosotros, detrás de su rostro misericordioso. O cuando alguien regresa a la Iglesia y nos preguntamos si su conversión fue genuina. O cuando cometemos algún pecado y ponemos cara triste durante días, pensando: "Tal vez mis pecados son demasiado grandes para que Dios los resuelva". ¡Dios nos salve de esa actitud!

Bueno, eso es exactamente lo que hace esta semana al criar a la hija de Jairo. La casa del niño muerto de doce años está llena de un espíritu de gemidos y gemidos excesivos, de llanto y lamentos tumultuosos. Incluso se ríen de Jesús en tono burlón. Es impactante lo fácil que le resulta resucitar a los muertos.

niño. Equivale a despertar suavemente a un niño de una siesta ligera. Y luego la envía a almorzar. Ningún gran grito. El drama hiperactivo es en realidad parte del problema y eliminarlo es una parte clave del milagro.

Amigos, el pecado puede matar y mata, pero Jesús siempre está listo y es capaz de resucitarnos a la vida, a menudo sin mucho alboroto. Su facilidad para perdonar nunca debe ser pretexto para la presunción, para minimizar el pecado o para tomar a la ligera el costo que paga por nuestros pecados en la cruz. Pero, por amor de Dios, a menudo necesitamos que Jesús apague a los que lloran y se lamentan. Él es el Señor. Y recuerda, la niña no está muerta, sólo está durmiendo.

El Toque de Cristo

Durante mucho tiempo no entendí por qué las misas virtuales de la pandemia me resultaban tan aburridas. En teoría, ¿no debería ser el sueño de una madre cansada, cumplir con su obligación dominical desde el sofá, sin tener que preocuparse por el ruido que hacen los niños?

Pero no fue así. Ver Misa sin experimentarla me dejó hambrienta. Me dejó muerta de hambre.

Entonces un sacerdote sabio me lo explicó. "Ver misa virtual es como tomar una ducha virtual," dijo.

Puede que la gracia no sea algo que podamos ver con nuestros ojos, pero es algo que se transmite físicamente. Jesús tiene un cuerpo humano por una razón. Necesita tocar a la gente.

En ninguna parte vemos esto más claramente que en este Evangelio. La multitud lo presiona, todos intentan acercarse, todos intentan compartir su espacio. La mujer con hemorragia se abre paso, desesperada por hacer contacto físico con él, cualquier parte de él, incluso su manto. El funcionario de la sinagoga le ruega a Jesús que venga e "imponga las manos" sobre su hija, sabiendo que esa es la única manera de que ella sobreviva. No pide los buenos deseos de Jesús ni su mirada de aprobación. Él sabe que eso no es lo que necesita.

En los Evangelios, Jesús salva a las personas principalmente a través de su propio toque porque quiere mostrarnos (a ti y a mí, sentados en las bancas) algo muy importante acerca de cómo somos salvados.

Pero ¿dónde encontramos tú y yo el toque de Jesucristo? ¿Dónde encontramos tú y yo la salvación?

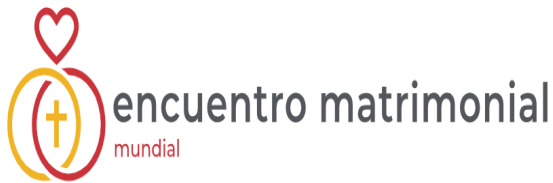

GOSPEL

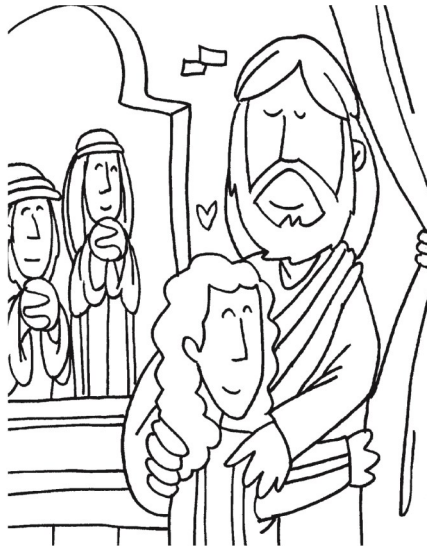

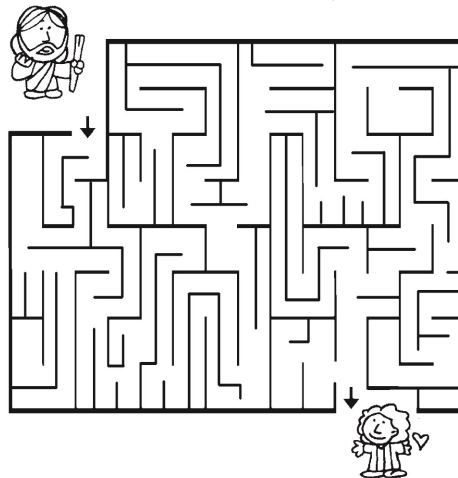
Dear God, you are even stronger than death. Help me to have faith in you like Jairus had. Amen

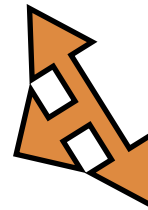
