Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time

LOVE GOD

As we near the end of the liturgical year we listen to Gospel readings from the final stage of Jesus' ministry—his teaching in Jerusalem. This Sunday Jesus is in conversation with one of the scribes of the temple. In a rare occurrence Jesus and the scribe agree on the two greatest commandments—to love God with all your being and to love your neighbor as yourself.

In today's selection from Deuteronomy Moses gives this teaching to the Israelites as the core of their life of faith and prayer, and Psalm 18 echoes this prayer with the words, "I love you, O Lord, my strength" (Psalm 18:2). Jews and Christians agree that our greatest responsibility is to love the one and only God, and that we cannot claim to love God without loving our neighbor as ourselves.

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TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — The Lord, the God of your fathers, will give you a land flowing with milk and honey (Deuteronomy 6:2-6).

Psalm — I love you, Lord, my strength (Psalm 18).

Second Reading — Jesus is always able to save those who approach God through him (Hebrews 7:23-28).

Gospel — To love God with all your heart and to love your neighbor as yourself is worth more than all burnt offerings and sacrifices (Mark 12:28b-34).

Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's First Reading, from Deuteronomy, we hear the great summary of the very core of God's covenant with Israel, its title taken from its opening word, the Shema ("Hear!"). The Shema is at once a doctrinal summary of Israel's faith and the personal/corporate prayer of Israel's sons and daughters. To this day, devout Jews inscribe the Shema on parchment and enclose it in the mezuzah that adorns the doorways of so many Jewish homes. The residents kiss the mezuzah, and thus the Word of God, upon entering their homes and when going forth from them into a world that often acknowledges neither God nor the covenant. Recited several times daily, Deuteronomy's "formula" comes alive as vivid reminder to devout Jews that their personal relationship with God is both source and safeguard of their public identity as members of God's chosen people.

EDITING THE GREAT COMMANDMENT

Today's Gospel shows Jesus as fully part of Israel's covenant tradition: he responds to the scribe's question by proclaiming Deuteronomy's Shema which both of them would have revered and recited since childhood: "Hear, O Israel! The Lord is our God, the Lord alone! Therefore you shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength" (Deuteronomy 6:4-5). But note the "editorial changes" both Jesus and the scribe make to the Shema. To Deuteronomy's heart, the Biblical seat of the will and affections, and soul, the deepest part of the human person, and strength, encompassing both physical ability and material treasure, Jesus adds "with all your mind," a phrase the scribe changes to "with all your understanding" (Mark 12:30, 33). Perhaps Mark, the author of today's Gospel, wanted to consecrate to the kingdom's service the philosophical reflection and intellectual exploration so valued by the Greco-Roman world—and our world—in which the Gospel would be preached.

KNOWING AND DOING

Jesus makes a further change to Israel's Shema: to the Deuteronomy text Jesus adds Leviticus 19:18: "you shall love your neighbor as yourself." For Jesus, these commandments cannot be separated. The scribe, delighted at Jesus' answer, goes on to indicate that he has grasped one of the central tenets of Jesus' kingdom: ritual worship and practical charity toward one's neighbor are twin expressions of love for God. This insight places the scribe "not far from the kingdom of God," says Jesus (Mark 12:34). But is "not far" close enough? For the scribe, as for the rich would-be disciple from a few Sundays ago,

FEAST OF FAITH—Prayer after Communion

The rites following the reception of Communion are very short. It is as if the Church is saying to us that the only way to respond to this great gift is to go forth and live it! But there are some significant rites yet before we are sent forth from the Mass. After Communion, we pray together in silence or sing a hymn; both are ways to thank God for the gift of the Son. Then the priest prays another collect, the Prayer after Communion. This prayer, usually very short, gathers our prayers into one. It reminds us of what we have already experienced: in receiving the Eucharist, we have received a foretaste of the heavenly banquet; we have eaten the bread of angels. This reality, this knowledge, should transform us, so that we may journey through this life with our hearts set on eternal life, and find in the Eucharist—which is food from heaven and daily bread—the strength and hope we need to work toward God’s kingdom of justice here and now.

Trigésimo Primer Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

AMA A DIOS

Al acercarnos al final del año litúrgico escuchamos las lecturas del Evangelio de la etapa final del ministerio de Jesús: sus enseñanzas en Jerusalén. Este domingo Jesús está en conversación con uno de los escribas del templo. En un hecho más bien raro, Jesús y el escriba están de acuerdo con los dos mandamientos: amar a Dios con todo tu ser y amar a tu prójimo como a ti mismo.

En la selección del Deuteronomio hoy, Moisés enseña a los hijos de Israel lo que es el centro de su vida de fe y oración, y el Salmo 17 hace eco a esta oración con las palabras: “Yo te amo, SEÑOR, tú eres mi fuerza” (Salmo 17:2). Judíos y cristianos están de acuerdo en que nuestra mayor responsabilidad es amar al Dios uno y único, y que no podemos pretender amar a Dios sin amar a nuestro prójimo como a nosotros mismos.

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LECTURAS DE HOY

Primera lectura — Guarden los mandamientos y normas del Señor. Ama al Señor, tu Dios, con todo tu ser (Deuteronomio 6:2-6).

Salmo — Yo te amo, Señor, tú eres mi fortaleza (Psalm 18 [17]).

FIESTA DE LA FE—La nueva alianza

La nueva alianza es Cristo mismo, el nuevo Israel es la Iglesia. Una vez más, Dios toma la iniciativa y se hace uno de nosotros, plenamente. La participación mutua de Dios no puede ser mayor, pues se hace uno de nosotros y habita entre nosotros. Las categorías se rompen totalmente, no hay deberes nuestros para con Cristo, hay respuesta a una invitación concreta: coman y beban, hagan esto en memoria mía. Jesús mismo instituye, en el contexto de una cena, una nueva alianza. Ya no se destrozará un animal y se pondrá su cuerpo en dos partes para pasar por en medio de ellos, siendo conscientes de que quien rompa esa alianza correrá la misma suerte. Cristo, al derramar su sangre, corta su propio cuerpo para sellar, mediante él, mediante su sangre, la nueva alianza. La noche antes de ser entregado, partió el pan y lo repartió diciendo que era su cuerpo; del mismo modo con el cáliz, sangre de la alianza nueva y eterna. Al beber su sangre nos hacemos uno con él, porque él ya se hizo uno con nosotros. La alianza no es en un animal sacrificado, sino en él mismo, que se hace cordero para el sacrificio. Lo imitamos en la medida en que nos damos a los demás.

Trigésimo Primer Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

En la primera lectura de hoy, tomada del Deuteronomio escuchemos el gran resumen del núcleo de la alianza de Dios con Israel, cuyo título está tomado de su palabra inicial, el Shemá (“¡Escucha!”). El Shemá es a la vez un resumen doctrinal de la fe de Israel y la oración personal/ colectiva de los hijos de e hijas de Israel. En la actualidad, los judíos devotos escriben el Shemá en un pergamino y lo incluyen en la mezuzá que adornan las puertas de muchos hogares judíos. Los residentes besan la mezuzá, y por tanto la palabra de Dios, al entrar en sus casas y al salir de ellas a un mundo que a menudo no reconoce ni a Dios ni a la alianza. Recitada varias veces al día, la “fórmula” del Deuteronomio cobra vida como un vívido recordatorio para los judíos devotos de que su relación personal con Dios es a la vez fuente y salvaguarda de su identidad pública como miembros del pueblo elegido de Dios.

EDITANDO EL GRAN MANDAMIENTO

El Evangelio de hoy muestra a Jesús como parte integrante de la tradición de la alianza de Israel: responde a la pregunta del escriba proclamando el Shemá del Deuteronomio que ambos habían reverenciado y recitado desde la infancia: “¡Escucha, Israel! El señor es nuestro Dios, sólo el Señor. Por eso amarás al Señor, tu Dios, con todo tu corazón, con toda tu alma y con todas tus fuerzas” (Deuteronomio 6:4-5). Pero fijate en los “cambios de redacción” que tanto Jesús como el escriba hacen en el Shemá. Al corazón del Deuteronomio, sede bíblica de la voluntad y los afectos, y el alma, la parte más profunda de la persona humana, y a la fuerza, que abarca tanto la capacidad física como el tesoro material, Jesús añade “con toda tu mente”, frase que el escriba cambia por “con todo tu entendimiento” (Marcos 12:30, 33). Tal vez Marcos, el autor del Evangelio de hoy, quiso consagrar el servicio del Reino a la reflexión filosófica y la exploración intelectual tan valoradas por el mundo grecorromano, y por el nuestro, en el que se predicaría el Evangelio.

SABER Y HACER

Jesús introduce un nuevo cambio al Shemá de Israel: al texto del Deuteronomio, Jesús añade Levítico 19:18: “amarás a tu prójimo como a ti mismo”. Para Jesús, estos mandamientos no pueden separarse. El escriba, encantado con la respuesta de Jesús, pasa a indicar que ha captado uno de los principios centrales del reino de Jesús: el culto ritual y la caridad práctica hacia el prójimo son expresiones gemelas del amor del amor a Dios. Esta idea sitúa al escriba “no muy lejos del reino de Dios”, dice Jesús (Marcos 12:34). Pero, ¿está “no muy lejos” lo suficientemente cerca? Para el escriba, como para el rico aspirante a discípulo de hace unos domingos, como para cada *Continúa en la siguiente columna...*
