Gospel Meditation

27th Sunday in Ordinary Time

As a young pastor years ago, I met with a middle-aged couple who had been divorced and civilly remarried. They were frustrated that an annulment had to precede a Church marriage. Sympathizing with their plight, I promised to walk with them along their journey. Once as we sat in my office, the man said to me, "Why is the Church so difficult on marriage?" I replied, "Actually, Jesus' teaching is what's difficult." He furrowed his brow and asked what I meant.

We opened the Bible and together read today's gospel passage from Mark 10:12 in which Jesus says, "**Whoever divorces his wife and marries another, commits adultery with her...**" My two friends sat in silent astonishment. Surely Jesus understands the complexities of human life and sexual love. The words hung thick and heavy in the air. How could the merciful Lord be so seemingly unrealistic in his expectations, especially with so much divorce and remarriage in our world?

I didn't know what to say. So, we kept reading. Next, Jesus says, "**Let the children come to me.**" The innocence of children allows them to receive and give love, to trust unconditionally, to believe in love that endures. Most children aren't yet jaded by statistics, broken hearts, or dysfunctional relationships. Children remind us of the world to come. The couple and I began to talk about child-like trust in Jesus and his teaching, and we continued to move forward. When it comes to the Church's demanding teaching on marriage, it's best to approach it as trusting children, whatever situations in which we find ourselves.

The Hardness of Your Hearts

As far as I know, no one has ever woken up in the morning, looked out the window, and thought, "This is a beautiful sunrise. I'll have to be very careful not to let it make me happy."

But I'm certain that every day, lots of people — including, on not-infrequent occasions, myself — have woken up and remembered something that happened the day before. Something that made us feel upset or frustrated or insulted. And we thought to ourselves, "That makes me so, so angry." And we've pictured the face of the person who made us feel that way, and we have scoffed with disgust.

And we hold onto that anger because anger feels so much better than sadness. And deep within ourselves, in the place where we feel all the love and pain and confusion that is inherent in human existence, we harden.

Nobody ever intends to be hard-hearted. That's just the stuff of Bond villains and horror flicks. No, in real life a hardened heart isn't a conscious choice. It's a reflex. It's just us trying to protect ourselves, to be strong — or, at least, to embody the version of strength offered by a fallen world.

A heart of stone is not so easily scratched, you see. But it's also not so easily warmed or touched or moved.

A heart hardened by resentment and pain and anger is not just protected from injury. It is protected from the impact of the whole spectrum of tender feelings. It is not open to forgiveness, so it cannot feel the rush of life-giving mercy. It is closed off to new ideas, so it can never feel the awe of discovery.

There is a reason we are called to guard ourselves against hard-heartedness. God gave us hearts of flesh and blood. They are hearts that can be broken, yes — but also, they are hearts that can be made new.

Meditación del Evangelio

27º Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

Hace años, cuando era un joven pastor, me encontré con una pareja de mediana edad que se había divorciado y vuelto a casar por lo civil. Estaban frustrados porque una anulación tenía que preceder a un matrimonio eclesiástico. Simpatizando con su situación, les prometí acompañarlos en su camino. Una vez, mientras estábamos sentados en mi oficina, el hombre me dijo: “¿Por qué la Iglesia es tan dura con el matrimonio?”. Le respondí: “En realidad, la enseñanza de Jesús es lo que es difícil”. Frunció el ceño y me preguntó qué quería decir.

Abrimos la Biblia y juntos leímos el pasaje del Evangelio de hoy de Marcos 10:12 en el que Jesús dice: “Quien se divorce de su mujer y se casa con otra, comete adulterio con ella...”. Mis dos amigos se quedaron sentados en silencio, asombrados. Seguramente Jesús entiende las complejidades de la vida humana y el amor sexual. Las palabras flotaban densas y pesadas en el aire. ¿Cómo podía el Señor misericordioso ser tan aparentemente poco realista en sus expectativas, especialmente con tanto divorcio y nuevo matrimonio en nuestro mundo?

No sabía qué decir. Así que seguimos leyendo. A continuación, Jesús dice: “Dejad que los niños vengan a mí”. La inocencia de los niños les permite recibir y dar amor, confiar incondicionalmente, creer en un amor que perdura. La mayoría de los niños aún no están hastiados por las estadísticas, los corazones rotos o las relaciones disfuncionales. Los niños nos recuerdan el mundo venidero. La pareja y yo comenzamos a hablar sobre la confianza infantil en Jesús y sus enseñanzas, y seguimos avanzando. Cuando se trata de la exigente enseñanza de la Iglesia sobre el matrimonio, es mejor abordarla como hijos confiados, independientemente de las situaciones en las que nos encontremos.

La Dureza de Sus Corazones

Que yo sepa, nadie se ha despertado por la mañana, ha mirado por la ventana y ha pensado: "Este es un hermoso amanecer. Tendré que tener mucho cuidado de no dejar que me haga feliz".

Pero estoy segura de que todos los días, muchas personas, incluyéndome a mí, en ocasiones no infrecuentes, nos hemos despertado y recordado algo que sucedió el día anterior. Algo que nos hizo sentir molestos, frustrados o insultados. Y pensamos: "Eso me enoja mucho". Y nos hemos imaginado la cara de la persona que nos hizo sentir de esa manera, y nos hemos burlado con disgusto.

Y nos aferramos a esa ira porque la ira se siente mucho mejor que la tristeza. Y en lo profundo de nosotros mismos, en el lugar donde sentimos todo el amor, el dolor y la confusión que es inherente a la existencia humana, nos endurecemos.

Nadie tiene la intención de ser duro de corazón. Eso es solo el material de los villanos de Bond y las películas de terror. No, en la vida real un corazón endurecido no es una elección consciente. Es un reflejo. Solo somos nosotros tratando de protegernos, de ser fuertes o, al menos, de encarnar la versión de fuerza que ofrece un mundo caído.

Un corazón de piedra no se raya tan fácilmente, como ves. Pero tampoco es tan fácil de calentar, tocar o mover.

Un corazón endurecido por el resentimiento, el dolor y la ira no solo está protegido de las heridas. Está protegido del impacto de todo el espectro de sentimientos tiernos. No está abierto al perdón, por lo que no puede sentir la ráfaga de la misericordia vivificante. Está cerrado a nuevas ideas, por lo que nunca puede sentir el asombro del descubrimiento.

Hay una razón por la que estamos llamados a guardarnos de la dureza de corazón. Dios nos dio corazones de carne y hueso. Son corazones que se pueden romper, sí, pero también son corazones que se pueden renovar.


