Gospel Meditation

30th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Near my house there is a school for the blind. Often, I see blind people learning how to navigate the world with only a walking stick, even on a busy street with roaring traffic. I'm amazed to see how adept and carefully they get around without sight. Nevertheless, often a sadness arises in me that he or she cannot see all the beautiful colors, images, and persons filling the world around them. Those days, I find myself deeply grateful for the basic privilege of sight.

That's part of why the mystery of Jesus as the sight-giver is so moving to me. This week, it's wonderful how Bartimaeus the blind man is no longer content with his limitation and bellows out his desire for Jesus' mercy. In beautiful simplicity, he cries out to the Lord, "**Master, let me receive my sight.**" Jesus quietly heals his sight. And off he goes, fully taking in the world around him. Imagine the delightful new way in which he is able to respond to the world.

Like blind Bartimaeus and the courageous people in my neighborhood, we may be able to get around reasonably well in our daily lives. But we are blind to the gestures of heroic love of people close to us. We can't see the desperate need of the hungry, thirsty, imprisoned, exploited, endangered, and so on, in our midst. We can't see Jesus drawing near to us in so many ways, but he is. This Sunday let's cry out to him: Lord have mercy on me! I want to see! And little by little — or perhaps in a flash — we'll see once again, or perhaps for the first time.

The Safety of Darkness

Leprosy and blindness and deafness — oh, my. The disabilities cured by Jesus in his public ministry really are quite something, aren't they? Vividly symbolic and rich food for reflection. It just wouldn't be the same if Jesus had cured eczema or athlete's foot or compulsive nail-biting.

Blind Bartimaeus, sitting by the side of the road, in particular captures my imagination. Because I have a confession to make, sometimes, I like to sit in the darkness, even though I know it isn't very good for me.

Well, listen: it's just easier, isn't it? You don't have to care about or fix the problems you can't see. No one expects you to rush to someone's aid if you don't see their injuries. The darkness is a good place to be, if you don't feel very brave or very smart or very able.

And when Jesus passes you by, if your whole world is darkness, it's easy enough to pretend you just didn't notice him at all.

But Bartimaeus chose not to stay in his darkness. More than that, he cried out to be released from it, even when everyone around him told him to shut up. He was so persistent that he caught the notice of Jesus, and when he heard those words — "Take courage; get up, Jesus is calling you!" — what did he do? He didn't stammer and run away. He had courage. He got up.

It takes courage to ask for what you need to follow Christ. Because if you ask for it, you'll get it. And then begins the terrifying, wonderful journey of discipleship — testifying to what you have seen. Life in the light, no longer sitting by the side of the road but *on* the road, journeying toward the greatest destination of all.

"What do you want me to do for you?" Jesus asks us.

Do we have the courage to answer him?

Meditación del Evangelio

30° Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

Cerca de mi casa hay una escuela para ciegos. A menudo veo a personas ciegas aprendiendo a moverse por el mundo con solo un bastón, incluso en una calle concurrida con mucho tráfico. Me sorprende ver con qué habilidad y cuidado se mueven sin ver. Sin embargo, a menudo surge en mí una tristeza porque no pueden ver todos los hermosos colores, imágenes y personas que llenan el mundo que los rodea. Esos días, me encuentro profundamente agradecido por el privilegio básico de la vista.

Esa es parte de la razón por la que el misterio de Jesús como el dador de la vista me conmueve tanto. Esta semana, es maravilloso cómo Bartimeo, el ciego, ya no está contento con su limitación y grita su deseo de la misericordia de Jesús. Con una hermosa sencillez, clama al Señor: "Maestro, haz que reciba la vista". Jesús sana su vista en silencio. Y se va, absorbiendo por completo el mundo que lo rodea. Imagine la nueva y encantadora forma en que puede responder al mundo.

Al igual que el ciego Bartimeo y las personas valientes de mi barrio, podemos movernos razonablemente bien en nuestra vida diaria, pero somos ciegos a los gestos de amor heroico de las personas cercanas a nosotros. No podemos ver la necesidad desesperada de los hambrientos, sedientos, encarcelados, explotados, en peligro, etc., que están en medio de nosotros. No podemos ver a Jesús acercándose a nosotros de muchas maneras, pero lo está haciendo. Este domingo clamemos a él: ¡Señor, ten piedad de mí! ¡Quiero ver! Y poco a poco, o tal vez en un instante, veremos una vez más, o tal vez por primera vez.

La Seguridad de la Oscuridad

La lepra, la ceguera y la sordera, ¡oh, Dios mío! Las discapacidades curadas por Jesús en su ministerio público realmente son algo muy importante, ¿no es así? Vividamente simbólicas y rico alimento para la reflexión. Simplemente no sería lo mismo si Jesús hubiera curado el eczema o el pie de atleta o el morderse las uñas compulsivamente.

El ciego Bartimeo, sentado al costado de la carretera, en particular, captura mi imaginación. Debido a que tengo una confesión que hacer, a veces, me gusta sentarme en la oscuridad, aunque sé que no es muy bueno para mí.

Bueno, escucha: es más fácil, ¿no? No tienes que preocuparte o solucionar los problemas que no puedes ver. Nadie espera que corras a ayudar a alguien si no ves sus heridas. La oscuridad es un buen lugar para estar, si no te sientes muy valiente o muy inteligente o muy capaz.

Y cuando Jesús pasa a tu lado, si todo tu mundo es oscuridad, es bastante fácil fingir que simplemente no lo notaste en absoluto.

Pero Bartimeo decidió no quedarse en su oscuridad. Más que eso, clamó para ser liberado de ella, incluso cuando todos a su alrededor le decían que se callara. Era tan persistente que llamó la atención de Jesús, y cuando escuchó esas palabras: "¡Ánimo; ¡Levántate, Jesús te está llamando!", ¿qué hizo? No tartamudeó ni huyó. Tenía valentía. Se levantó.

Se necesita valentía para pedir lo que necesitas para seguir a Cristo. Porque si lo pides, lo obtendrás. Y entonces comienza el aterrador y maravilloso viaje del discipulado, testificando de lo que has visto. La vida en la luz, ya no sentados al lado del camino, sino *en* el camino, viajando hacia el destino más grande de todos.

"¿Qué quieres que haga por ti?" Jesús nos pregunta.



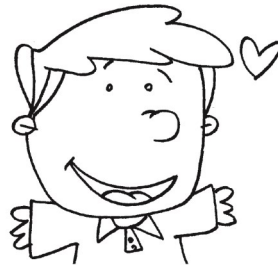
