13th Sunday in Ordinary Time

As a boy my favorite board game was “Chutes and Ladders.” The players roll dice to move from the start to the finish, from the bottom of the board to the top. If you land on a chute, you slide back and down. It was a bummer. Land on a ladder, and you jump well up the board and near the goal. It was a thrill to find a ladder and draw closer to the goal. That’s life, isn’t it? At every moment, we’re either moving closer or farther from the goal of our lives.

How do we win? Jesus tells us the secret of life’s chutes and ladders hinges on getting our loves rightly ordered. What we love in life is meant to be a ladder, drawing us up into God’s love — including our family, friends, work, play, food, and drink. Even to give your water to someone out of love for Christ leads to a sure reward.

But those ladders of our loves can become chutes. If we love even our family members more than Christ, we slide down and back. If we love the persons and things in our life for the sake of Christ, He says we “surely will not lose our reward.” The key difference between a chute and ladder, between our spiritual regression and advancement, is our willingness to renounce everything — even our own life — for the love of Jesus. To allow everything and everyone we love to draw us to love him more — that’s the difference between chutes and ladders.

Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time A Prophet's Reward

"Move back in with us until you save enough for a decent house," my mother told me over and over again as the birth of my second child neared.

My little family was quickly outgrowing our rented space, but the housing market in our area was a nightmare for first-time homebuyers. As appealing as the offer was, I kept refusing, convinced that my mother didn't understand the chaos, disruption, and loss of personal space that such a move would mean for her and my dad.

I was wrong — she did. And eventually she wore me down. When my son was three months old my family of four moved back into my old bedroom. My parents made an office space for my husband in the basement, and they converted their den into a playroom for two of the loudest children you will ever meet. They told us we could stay as long as we needed to (it ended up being two years). They greeted us with love and warmth every morning and never made us feel like we were an inconvenience.

Today's first reading always reminds me of my mom, not because I consider myself a prophet (hardly) but because of the way she received me — specifically, in whose name she received me.

I've always tried to understand exactly what makes my parents' acts of love — toward me, toward each other, toward perfect strangers — feel so genuine. I think, after more than 30 years, I've finally realized the secret: my parents love God more than they love me. They love God more than they love anyone.

Like making room in their life and their home for me and my boisterous family, these acts originate in sacrifice. They don't come cheap. They come from the cross. "Whoever loses his life for my sake will find it." — Matthew 10:39 ©LPi

“El que los recibe a ustedes, a mí me recibe, y el que me recibe a mí, recibe a Aquel que me ha enviado” (Mateo 10:40). Con esta frase del Evangelio Jesús lo explica todo con lo referente a dar y recibir. ¿Quién es más feliz, el que da o el que recibe? La respuesta puede ser basada en la medida en que hemos dado y en la apertura del corazón para recibir. Si recibimos a Jesús por medio de los que nos rodean estamos recibiendo al Padre del cielo. Todo lo que demos no se quedará sin recompensa. “Asimismo, el que dé un vaso de agua fresca a uno de estos pequeños, por ser mi discípulo, no quedará sin recompensa” (Mateo 10:42). Con esta enseñanza, Jesús nos quiere mostrar que la sabiduría de Dios supera los criterios humanos.

Quien recibe la palabra de Dios, se pone inmediatamente al servicio de los demás. No la conserva para sí mismo. Por el contrario, sale, la comparte, la manifiesta, la multiplica en gracia y justicia. La salvación de Dios es para todos. El compromiso es continuar su obra evangelizadora en todos los rincones del mundo. “El verdadero amor a Jesús requiere verdadero amor a los padres, a los hijos, pero si primero buscamos el interés familiar, esto siempre nos lleva por el camino equivocado” (Papa Francisco 6/28/2020). 13º Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario La Recompensa de un Profeta

“Vuelve a vivir con nosotros hasta que ahorres lo suficiente para una casa decente,” me decía mi madre una y otra vez a medida que se acercaba el nacimiento de mi segundo hijo.

Mi pequeña familia estaba superando rápidamente nuestro espacio alquilado, pero el mercado inmobiliario en nuestra área era una pesadilla para los compradores de vivienda por primera vez. A pesar de lo atractiva que era la oferta, seguí negándome, convencida de que mi madre no entendía el caos, la interrupción y la pérdida de espacio personal que significaría tal movimiento para ella y mi padre.

Yo estaba equivocada, si lo sabía. Y eventualmente ella me desgastó. Cuando mi hijo tenía tres meses, mi familia de cuatro se mudó a mi antiguo dormitorio. Mis padres hicieron un espacio de oficina para mi esposo en el sótano y convirtieron su estudio en una sala de juegos para dos de los niños más ruidosos que jamás hayas conocido. Nos dijeron que podíamos quedarnos todo el tiempo que necesitáramos (al final fueron dos años). Nos saludaron con amor y calidez todas las mañanas y nunca nos hicieron sentir como si fuéramos un inconveniente.

La primera lectura de hoy siempre me recuerda a mi mamá, no porque me considere un profeta (dificilmente) sino por la forma en que me recibió, específicamente, en nombre de quién me recibió.

Siempre he tratado de entender exactamente qué hace que los actos de amor de mis padres (hacia mí, el uno hacia el otro, hacia perfectos extraños) se sientan tan genuinos. Creo que, después de más de 30 años, finalmente me di cuenta del secreto: mis padres aman a Dios más de lo que me aman a mí. Aman a Dios más de lo que aman a nadie.

Como hacer espacio en su vida y en su hogar para mí y mi bulliciosa familia, estos actos se originan en el sacrificio. No son baratos. Vienen de la cruz.
