THE DAYS ARE COMING

Separation, isolation, and hostility are terrible things. We are, sadly, too familiar with all of them in our modern life, whether we look at world events or events in our own neighborhoods and families. All three readings today refer to these same sad human conditions.

The prophet Jeremiah describes world conditions as if the people of his time were sheep who had been scattered by poor leadership and corrupt shepherds. But “the days are coming,” he assures us (Jeremiah 23:5), when a new shepherd, a just king, will come. We meet that king in the second reading and the Gospel. Paul reminds us in the Letter to the Ephesians that all divisions can now cease in Christ Jesus, who has brought us together through his blood. In Mark’s Gospel we see Jesus himself, looking with pity on those searching for him as if they were sheep without a shepherd.

Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

If we were to use one word to describe the scriptures for today, it would be “compassion.” In Jeremiah, God rails against those who have scattered the sheep, and vows to “gather the remnant” personally. We also hear the prophecy about the coming Messiah. In Ephesians, Christ is breaking down the walls of division between peoples and drawing them to be reconciled with God in peace. In Mark, Jesus calls the tired disciples away to rest and have some “me time,” but even then the crowds persisted. Jesus saw their spiritual hunger and neediness and was “moved with pity.” All three situations involve looking beyond one’s own agenda to see the needs of others and respond. God models how to empathize with others. May we continue to learn to be kinder, gentler, and more caring for each other.

TIME FOR A TEAM MEETING

In last week’s Gospel, Jesus sent the apostles out two by two. Today we see him bringing them back together, reporting “all they had done and taught.” A lot has happened between then and now and in this time the disciples experienced many things. They would have grown in their ministry and their ability to heal and preach, but they probably also ran into frustrating times and encountered their limitations as human beings. If human nature prevailed, their partners were driving them nuts! So now after all this sharing, Jesus called for some balance in their lives. It was time to come away and rest. Between family and friends and social media, many of us have lost this ability to “be by ourselves” as we have become accustomed to filling every day and every moment with distractions. Perhaps one of the gifts and challenges of “sheltering in place” these last months is that we celebrated moments of joy and hope and peace but were also forced to listen to and name those voices of anger, loneliness, and fear.

WELL LAID PLANS

It is important to have balance in our lives, and Jesus was indeed was trying to teach this to the Apostles, but when they got to their intended place of repose, they encountered so many people Jesus was filled with compassion. No doubt he went about feeding them spiritually and physically; it would have been important for him to be hospitable. But at some point in time, I’m guessing that he still pulled the apostles aside and told them “Okay, people are settled now, so let’s leave all the excitement, delegate the job to somebody else, and find some peace and quiet.” None of us is any good at our prayer, our ministries, our lives, unless we take the time to find the quiet and go back to replenish our own wells. There is no way we can give to others unless we do. That is why we

Confraternity of Christian Doctrine (CCD)

The CCD Program is now accepting registrations for children 6 to 13 years of age. Register from August 2 to August 27 in the Parish Office on Monday, Wednesday or Friday from 9AM to 12PM and 1PM to 6PM. Register on Sunday in Padua Hall from 11:30AM to 1:30PM.

A Baptismal Certificate must be presented at the time of registration. The fee is \$100 per child. \$75 for the second sibling and \$25 for the third sibling. The siblings must be in the same program. The duration of the Program will be for 2 years. Student classes will be in English. Mandatory Parent Class will be in English and Spanish at the same time and day as the student. Classes will be on Sunday from 11:30AM to 1:30PM. The First Day of class is Sunday, September 12, 2021.

Register today for the next program beginning in October 2021 at the Serra Catechetical Institute (SCI). The deadline to register is September 1, 2021. SCI is a 1-year formation process for parish and Catholic school catechists, parents and all adults who want to know their Catholic faith better and be able to hand it on more effectively. Participants will receive a solid introduction to the Catholic faith in 60 hours of basic catechetical formation, including: Spiritual development (our own relationship with Jesus), Doctrinal formation (sacraments, creed, and morality), and Catechetical process and methodology (how to teach the faith). Students who complete the program will be eligible to receive the Basic California Catechist Certificate.

LLEGARÁN LOS DÍAS

Separación, aislamiento y hostilidad son cosas terribles. Estamos, por desgracia, demasiado familiarizados con todos ellos en nuestra vida actual, si nos fijamos en los acontecimientos mundiales o los que ocurren en nuestros propios vecindarios y familias. Las tres lecturas de hoy se refieren a estas mismas y tristes condiciones humanas.

El profeta Jeremías describe las condiciones del mundo, como si la gente de su tiempo fuera la oveja que se había dispersado por falta de guía y pastores corruptos. Sin embargo “viene un tiempo”, nos asegura (Jeremías 23:5), cuando surgirá un nuevo pastor, un rey justo. Nos encontramos con ese rey en la segunda lectura y el Evangelio. Decimosexto Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

Si tuviéramos que usar una palabra para describir las Escrituras de hoy, esa sería “compasión”. En Jeremías, Dios reprende contra los que han dispersado a las ovejas, y promete “reunir al resto” personalmente. También escuchamos la profecía sobre la llegada del Mesías. En la carta a los efesios, Cristo derriba los muros de la división entre los pueblos y los lleva a reconciliarse en paz con Dios. En Marcos, Jesús llama a los discípulos cansados para que descansen y tengan algo de tiempo “personal”, pero aún así las multitudes continuaban. Jesús vio su hambre y necesidad espiritual y se “compadeció”. Las tres situaciones implican mirar más allá de los propios intereses para ver las necesidades de los demás y responder. Dios es un modelo de cómo empatizar con las demás personas. Que sigamos aprendiendo a ser más amables, más bondadosos y solidarios con los demás.

HORA DE UNA REUNIÓN DE EQUIPO

En el Evangelio de la semana pasada, Jesús envió a los apóstoles de dos en dos. Hoy lo vemos reuniéndolos, informando de “todo lo que habían hecho y enseñado”. Muchas cosas pasaron entre ese tiempo y ese ahora en que los discípulos experimentaron muchas cosas. Crecieron en su trabajo misionero y la capacidad de curar y predicar, pero ellos probablemente también llegaron a tener momentos frustrantes y encontraron sus limitaciones como seres humanos. ¡Si la naturaleza humana se imponía, sus compañeros los estaban volviendo locos! Así que ahora después de todo el compartir que hubo, Jesús pidió algo de estabilidad en sus vidas. Era tiempo de alejarse y descansar. Entre la familia, los amigos y las redes sociales, muchos de nosotros perdimos la capacidad de “estar solos”, pues ya nos hemos acostumbrados a llenar cada día y cada momento con distracciones. Tal vez una de las fortalezas y desafíos de “refugiarse en un lugar” estos últimos meses es que celebramos momentos de alegría, de esperanza y de paz, pero también nos vimos forzados a escuchar y nombrar esas voces de ira, soledad y miedo.

PLANES BIEN TRAZADOS

Es importante tener una estabilidad en nuestras vidas, y Jesús de hecho estaba tratando de enseñar esto a sus Apóstoles, pero cuando llegaron al lugar donde habían previsto descansar, se encontraron con tanta gente que Jesús tuvo compasión. Sin duda, se dedicó a alimentarlos espiritual y físicamente, tendría que ser importante para él ser hospitalario. Pero, en algún momento, estoy suponiendo que junto a los apóstoles se apartó y les dijo: “está bien por ahora, las personas ya están asentadas, dejemos este tumulto, deleguemos

el trabajo a alguien más y hallemos algo de paz y tranquilidad”. 
