REVELATION OF GOD'S PRESENCE

Today's first reading from Isaiah arises out of the ordeal of the people of Jerusalem and Judea as they anticipate the end of seventy years of exile in Babylon. Their sufferings and their oppression will end, and they are promised joy like that of a great wedding upon returning to their homeland. Although this passage is probably set in the early sixth century B.C., it is free of historical particulars. Accordingly, the Church has understood its imagery universally, as it proclaims God's promise of healing, hope, and happiness for all peoples, in this world and in the next. When read against this background, the story of Jesus' turning water into wine at the wedding at Cana becomes a revelation of God's presence in the person of Jesus, making these promises real for us in the here and now, in the transformation of our own lives.

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

"For Pete's sake will you kids be quiet?" This question, no doubt, has passed the lips of numerous parents through the years. It's tempting to speculate as to who, exactly, was instructing Isaiah to be quiet. Neighbors? Fellow prophets? Family? No matter. Isaiah says firmly that for the sake of Jerusalem and Zion he will not be silent. Conversely, in the familiar passage in today's Gospel reading, Mary chides her son to break his silence, to save the wedding soon to run out of wine. Jesus responds with a prophetic action, one that signals the miraculous, bountiful joy flowing at the heavenly wedding feast. Prophetic words, prophetic deeds--both flow from a broken silence.

The Corinthians seem to have been Paul's problem children. His two letters to them are much longer than any of his other letters--two, three, or four times as long as some. It seems that if the early Christians at Corinth could misunderstand or do something wrong, they would. Fortunately for us, the two letters to the Corinthians, though they contain much didactic or instructional material, also provide some of Paul's most well-crafted and grace-filled writing. This is certainly true today, with Paul's litany of gifts that the Spirit bestows on the faithful, even to this day. Paul seeks to calm the squabbling that seems to have been going on, as the Corinthians tried to claim one gift or another as more important. All gifts come from the same Spirit, Paul reminds them; and the various gifts are given for the benefit of the community. When jealousy arises in our midst today, we can still turn to Paul's insights so we might stop being prideful, problem children.

WONDROUS CHILD

In the Gospel scene at Cana, we see Mary turning to her own child, Jesus. Perhaps she recalled the power of the Spirit that had flowed in her womb at his Incarnation, leading her to discern that surely he must have Spirit-given gifts that could help with the impending crisis at the wedding. As at her Annunciation, she may not have been completely certain, at first, exactly how this would come about, but in faith at Cana she turned to Jesus. In faith, her words, "do whatever he tells you," echoed her reply to Gabriel: "Let it be done to me as you say." In faith, she knows whatever words the Word will speak are bound to bring another inbreaking of the Spirit, another manifestation of God's reign. And she is right. Her wondrous child, John the Evangelist tells us, performed his first wonder there, and signaled the presence of the divine in the everyday.

Diocese of Oakland Office of Worship Attendance at Mass

Please be aware that the obligation to attend Sunday Mass does not apply to those who are ill, especially those who suffer from contagious disease. Long before this pandemic, the Church has always recognized that there are "serious" or "grave" reasons that prevent Catholics from attending Mass. For example, if a person is sick or homebound, or living/visiting areas of the world where access to the Mass is limited, or a situation arises that prevents travel (snowstorm or flat tire), such persons would not be bound by the obligation.

In the case of this pandemic, serious or grave reasons would include:

- Anyone who is sick, symptomatic, or has been recently exposed to the coronavirus. Protecting the health of others is an act of Christian charity and our moral duty to one another.
- Anyone with significant health risk factors that requires them to avoid public spaces, or if you care for someone with significant risk factors.
- Anyone who cannot attend Mass through no fault of their own, for example, a parent caring for a sick child, or if the priest is sick.

As always, you are reminded to use common good sense in the reception of Holy Communion during the annual cold and flu season as well.

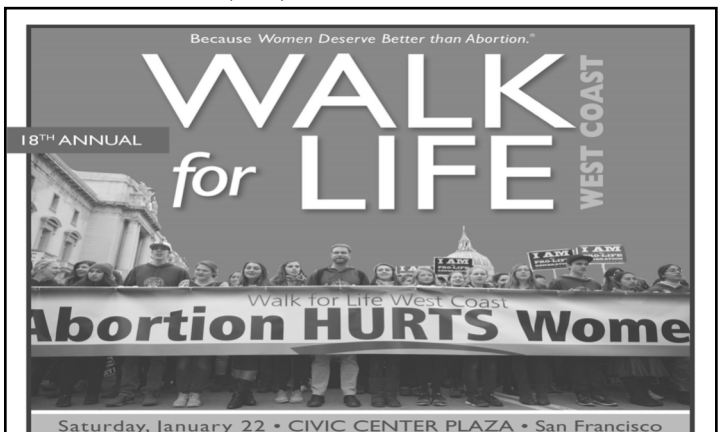

REVELACIÓN DE LA PRESENCIA DE DIOS

La primera lectura de hoy de Isaías surge del sufrimiento del pueblo de Jerusalén y de Judea cuando ellos anticiparon el final de los setenta años de exilio en Babilonia. Sus sufrimientos y su opresión terminarán, y se les promete una alegría como la de una boda espléndida al regresar a su patria. Aunque es probable que este pasaje sucedió a principios del siglo VI AC, carece de los detalles históricos. En este sentido, la Iglesia ha entendido sus metáforas de forma universal, ya que proclama la promesa de Dios de curación, esperanza y felicidad para todos los pueblos, en este mundo y en el otro. Cuando se lee este contexto, la historia de Jesús convirtiendo el agua en vino en las bodas de Canaán se convierte en una revelación de la presencia de Dios en la persona de Jesús, haciendo que estas promesas sean verdaderas para nosotros aquí y ahora, en la transformación de nuestras propias vidas.

Segundo Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

"Por el amor de Dios, ¿se pueden callar?" Esta pregunta, sin duda, ha pasado por los labios de numerosos padres a lo largo de los años. Resulta tentador especular sobre quién exactamente, le ordenaba a Isaías que se callara. ¿Los vecinos? ¿Compañeros profetas? ¿La familia? No importa. Isaías dice con firmeza que, por el bien de Jerusalén y Sion, no se callará. A la inversa, en el conocido pasaje de la lectura del Evangelio de hoy, María reprende a su hijo para que rompa su silencio, para salvar la boda que pronto se va a quedar sin vino. Jesús responde con una acción profética, que señala la alegría milagrosa y abundante que fluye en el banquete de bodas celestial. Palabras proféticas, hechos proféticos: ambos surgen de un silencio roto.

Los corintios parecen haber sido los hijos problemáticos de Pablo. Sus dos cartas a ellos son mucho más largas que cualquiera de sus otras cartas - dos, tres o cuatro veces más largas que algunas. Parece que, si los primeros cristianos de Corinto podían malinterpretar o hacer algo mal, lo hacían. Afortunadamente para nosotros, las dos cartas a los Corintios, aunque contienen mucho material didáctico o instructivo, también proporcionan algunos de los escritos más bien elaborados y llenos de gracia de Pablo. Esto es ciertamente cierto hoy en día, con a letanía de dones que el Espíritu concede a los fieles, incluso hasta el día de hoy. Pablo trata de calmar la disputa que parece haber existido, ya que los corintios trataban de reclamar un don u otro como más importante. Todos los dones proceden del mismo Espíritu, les recuerda Pablo, y los distintos dones se conceden en beneficio de la comunidad. Cuando los celos surgen en nuestro entorno, podemos recurrir a las ideas de Pablo para dejar de ser niños orgullosos y problemáticos.

EL NIÑO DESEADO

En la escena evangélica de Caná, vemos a María dirigirse a su propio hijo, Jesús. Tal vez recordaba la fuerza del Espíritu que había fluido en su vientre en el momento de su encarnación, lo que la llevó a discernir que seguramente él debía tener dones otorgados por el Espíritu que podrían ayudar en la inminente crisis de la boda. Al igual que en la Anunciación, es posible que al principio no estuviera completamente segura de cómo se produciría esto, pero en Caná se dirigió a Jesús con fe. Con fe, sus palabras, "hagan lo que él les diga", se hicieron eco de su respuesta a Gabriel: "Hágase en mí lo que tú digas".

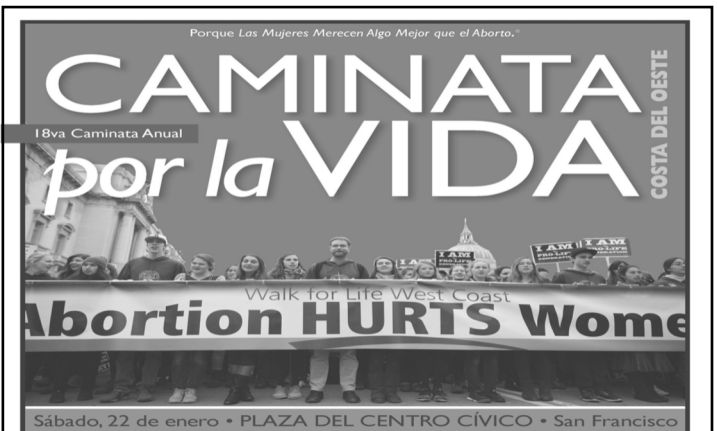
